CAMERA

GLOSSY. Label is green & pink.
Paper is light sensitive and can only be opened under the safelights!

CAMERA NOTE!

This class is 2/3 film, 1/3 digital. Students are strongly encouraged to purchase a film camera, which may easily be resold at semester's end. Cameras start at about \$150. If purchase presents an issue, the program has some cameras available for loan. Please speak to professor. Digital camera purchase is not required for this class, but you will learn to use your digital camera, if you have one, and have a chance to work with a Buffalo State digital camera.

OTHER SUPPLIES

- PrintFile Negative Pages (CP35-7HB or CP35-7B) pack of 25 for storing film (can split with another student)
- Blotter Books Either 9x12" or 12x18" in size. You must have your blotter book in order to take home prints from darkroom as you leave, or use drying rack at your own risk.
- Pencil for making exposure notes on the back of prints before placing in the chemistry
- Scissors, for cutting film
- 8"x10" Archival portfolio box recommended

- All these retailers have used cameras for sale. If shopping online, make sure item is listed as in working order & that returns are accepted. Make sure they are providing any battery you need for camera to function, or buy battery separately. If shopping in person, before you leave the store ask them to show you that shutter speeds work in a range from 1 second to 1/125th of a second. Inspect camera for damage & compare it to other cameras they have.
- WARNING: eBay has wonderful deals but is not a wise choice for class. You need a camera shipped immediately and you will have no recourse if camera is defective. Dealers listed above will swap out defective cameras.
