** The Interior Design Qualification Exam is offered in May. Successful completion of Skills Exam will be required to move to the Sophomore year. Students who fail may be required to take the 'Fundamental skills of interior design' over the summer before they can sit for a repeat Skills Exam in the Fall.

Additional Degree Requirements

In addition to the Interior Design major coursework and the general education coursework (Intellectual Foundations Program)*, all undergraduate degree candidates must meet the following college wide graduation requirements:

- Successful completion of required coursework in the declared major
- Successful completion of at least 120 hours of which at least 33 must be upper division and 32 must be taken at Buffalo State, including the last 16
- Successful completion of all “I”, “N”, or “X” grades
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.6 after the freshman year is required by the Interior Design Department as stated in the current Buffalo State Online Undergraduate Catalog.
- *The general education courses do not have to be taken in the order in which they are listed on the front of this sheet. The scheduling and sequencing of the Intellectual Foundations coursework is the student’s choice with guidance from her/his advisor. **These courses are marked with an asterisk - ***
